Key Messages

In Leeds, our £36 billion economy is outperforming the UK, and by supercharging our three key sectors, which already drive 60% of our growth, we have ambitious plans to unlock further economic growth with a £20 billion uplift and 100,000 new jobs. The city is defining and showcasing economic opportunity at the heart of the North.

Financial and Professional Services

Located in the heart of the UK and home to the northern square mile, West Yorkshire is the largest FPS sector outside London. We have a plan to more than double the growth in the sector in the city over the next decade and in turn create 50,000 jobs.

Leeds is a leader in LegalTech, and a growing hub for fintech and innovation which is seeing global anchors land in the city.

We are home to over 40 national and international banks, 150 accountancy firms including the Big Four, global legal companies and all 3 of the UK's major credit reference agencies

Leeds has strengths in payments, lending, banking, Wealthtech, RegTech and Green Finance.

Digital

West Yorkshire is home to 9,700 digital and tech businesses, employing over 50,000 people. The tech sector in Leeds is growing 125% faster than the national average with strengths in fintech, data, cybersecurity and AI businesses – underscoring its national significance and investor confidence.

Collaboration is key across the city and we are home to the UK's largest open tech event, the Leeds Digital Festival. The city's booming media, film, gaming and other creative sectors are home to the likes of Sky, Flutter, XR Games, Rockstar, Planet Sport and Channel 4. Leeds also boasts a wealth of agencies and consultancies, providing a range of bespoke services from marketing to design and software development, while welcoming international organisations such as the Canadian multinational, CGI, GoCardless and Australian FinTech unicorn, PEXA, to the city.

AI jobs in Leeds are outpacing London and the sector is forecast to add £4.6 billion to West Yorkshire's economy by 2035. There is major opportunity in East Leeds to build an AI Zone, centred around Microsoft which has invested over £100m to purchase a site at Skelton Grange as part of its £2.5bn commitment to the UK building hyperscale datacentres.

Health

When it comes to health innovation, Leeds is setting the pace and shaping the future. Home of the NHS, we rank in the top three globally as a healthtech hub, and our tech sector is growing 125% faster than the national average, with AI job growth outpacing London.

We're the government's go-to location to drive the national health mission and the place where national policy meets frontline innovation to deliver the 'three shifts' identified in the NHS 10-year plan.

This is the city where breakthroughs are born and ideas are tested at speed. It's where bold partnerships turn world-leading research into reality, and where businesses start, scale and go global thanks to standout support.

From world-first surgical techniques to globally-leading trials, Leeds has been transforming health and care for over a century. Innovation through collaboration is in our DNA.

Our city is home to a dedicated Department of Health and Social Care (DHSC) Leeds Health and Social Care Hub, and has now been chosen to:

- host The Medicines and Healthcare products Regulatory Agency (MHRA's) new Digital Hub, bringing regulation and innovation closer together for faster adoption and impact, and
- lead in the first wave of the government's National Neighbourhood Health Implementation Programme, which reflects our uniquely connected ecosystem, building on integration of NHS, social care and the voluntary sector to reduce health inequalities and bring care closer to home.

Leeds is one of the UK's top five research delivery centres, and a top UK city for health research funding - with more than £480m in combined UKRI medtech and NIHR funding. Crucially, we have a uniquely interconnected ecosystem connecting businesses with top healthtech support, plus one of the country's biggest teaching hospitals halving clinical trial setup times.

The West Yorkshire Investment Zone will deliver £160m of investment over ten years and is already supporting the development of the health innovation ecosystem with a series of capital and revenue investments in Leeds.

Major Projects

Boasting an extensive talent pipeline, 6 world-class universities, a vast range of sectors and an economy worth £36 billion, Leeds is a hotspot for business, finance and technology.

To support growth in Leeds, we have delivered:

- A new rail station at Kirkstall Forge.
- £46 million investment in Leeds Rail Station to create a multi-modal gateway including a pedestrian priority area, improved accessibility, segregated cycle lanes, a 700-space cycle hub and infrastructure for ebikes.
- The £200 million Leeds Public Transport Investment programme to improve public transport and active travel.
- £125 million flood alleviation scheme for the River Aire, providing critical flood resilience measures for the city.

The Next Big Projects Are...

Leeds Mayoral Development Zone

Leeds City Council and West Yorkshire Combined Authority are working to establish a multi-partner Mayoral Development Zone (MDZ) to drive the delivery of the Leeds Transformational Regeneration areas, including the proposed New Town and parts of the West End Riverside and Eastern growth areas. This will be complemented through the creation of a single multi-agency 'Leeds Growth' team led by Leeds City Council, including regional and national public sector partners, to ensure a single front door with the public sector for developers and investors.

Leeds South Bank

The Government's announcement that the South Bank be considered as a potential 'New Town' location adds to the real momentum in this area. The area includes Vastint's Aire Park and residential developments, as well as two major investments in cultural anchors – the Royal Armouries and the opportunity for a new home for British Library North, and landmark regeneration schemes including Caddick's South Village.

Royal Armouries

An ambitious refurbishment and redevelopment plan which will deliver a new riverside cultural heritage, events and conference space, along with a new 150-bed hotel, providing a culture-led anchor for the regeneration of Leeds South Bank and guaranteeing the long-term sustainability of the Royal Armouries Museum.

Elland Road

A landmark 30-acre regeneration project, anchored by Leeds United Football Club's ambitious redevelopment of its stadium creating a vibrant, mixed-use year-round destination for Leeds with the potential to unlock billions in the neighbourhood.

Temple Works

A new major mixed-use development, with potential for housing, innovation space and other destination uses, including the opportunity for a new home for British Library North – this Grade I Listed building is a landmark regeneration scheme.

Northern Square Mile

We are set to double the rate of growth of the city's thriving financial services cluster to create an additional 50,000 new jobs in the finance and professional services sector. This strategic economic zone is intrinsically linked to the ongoing development of the South Bank, accelerating the expansion of the city centre.

Leeds Innovation Arc

Brings together a series of innovation neighbourhoods, formed around the natural anchors of universities, the proposed adult and children's hospitals and major private sector partners. Set across 150 hectares of the city centre the Arc is stitching together some of the most significant innovation assets in the country.

Leeds Innovation Village

A key area within the Innovation Arc and a flagship project of the West Yorkshire Health Innovation and Digital Investment Zone, it will offer offices, lab space and homes, and accelerate high-growth sectors like HealthTech and MedTech. The regeneration of the Grade II* listed Old Medical School is the first step and a significant investment to accelerate delivery.

Leeds-Bradford Airport's Vision 2030

Backed by £200 million in private investment, the strategy is to improve passenger experience and drive sustainable growth as the airport reaches an anticipated seven million passengers a year by 2030. The aim is to create up to 5,500 new jobs and contribute £1 billion to the local economy. The new Parkway Railway Station will serve the airport alongside the proposals for the 36-hectare North West Leeds employment hub.

Skelton Grange

An important industrial and logistics space, having a 100MW battery energy storage system, energy and waste facility and a hyperscale data centre as part of Microsoft's recent next-generation AI investment in the UK. This puts Leeds in the global tier two for such facilities. This will be part of a new AI Opportunity Zone that has the potential to become a major data and technology cluster and unlock skills, jobs and innovation opportunities.

Leeds Rail Station Programme

Ahead of the completion of the Transpennine Route Upgrade, this scheme will add a new bridge between platforms, a new southern entrance, an improved concourse and an extended platform 14 so that Leeds station can continue to accommodate the increasing passenger demands for the busiest rail station in the north.

Future Pipeline

- Campus Reimagined – The University of Leeds's emerging masterplan framework.
- National Poetry Centre proposal to redevelop a former church into a centre for poetry and creative writing.
- East of Otley – plans to deliver a new neighbourhood with new homes, school and green space.
- North-West Leeds Employment Hub to develop business space close to Yeadon and Horsforth and in close proximity to Leeds Bradford Airport.
